<p>Exhibition „Number Six: Flaming Creatures“ JULIA STOSCHEK COLLECTION</p>	<p>Number Six: Flaming Creatures exhibition at the JULIA STOSCHEK COLLECTION. A key starting point for the exhibition, and one of immense historical importance, is the work of US underground artist, performer and filmmaker Jack Smith (born in 1932); his scandal-sparking film FLAMING CREATURES (1962-63) is the source of the title of the new presentation. Jack Smith's oeuvre strongly inspired an entire generation of artists such as Andy Warhol, Robert Wilson, Cindy Sherman, John Waters and Mike Kelley. <p>Exhibition „Wolfgang Tillmans“ Kunstsammlung Nordrhein-Westfalen K21 Ständehaus</p>	<p>A solo exhibition of the internationally acclaimed photographer and Turner Prize winner Wolfgang Tillmans (born 1968 in Remscheid, Germany) in cooperation with the Moderna Musset in Stockholm. In this exhibition a comprehensive and multifaceted oeuvre of photographs, abstract paintings, table installations, videos and art books will be presented. <p>„Peer Gynt“ Düsseldorfer Schauspielhaus</p>	<p>Dramatic poem by Henrik Ibsen, directed by Staffan Valdemar Holm. “Peer Gynt” tells of a man driven by his wishes, appetites and desires, before finally trying to make sense of everything: What determines someone's identity. Flamenco Festival tanzhaus nrw	Held around Easter, this festival will see the crème de la crème of flamenco take to the stage at the tanzhaus nrw. Traditional flamenco shows performed by famous ensembles will be presented alongside experimental crossover projects to broaden the horizon of this art form. Flamenco dance and live music will blend into a uniquely intensive theatre experience. Düsseldorf Jazz Rally different venues	Germany's biggest jazz festival held at many venues throughout the city features around 80 bands and performers who will transform Düsseldorf into a swinging and dancing city, 17 – 19 May 2013 www.duesselder-jazzrally.de
Japan Day Düsseldorf / NRW different venues	Japan Day Düsseldorf / NRW – on this day Düsseldorf, the traditional stronghold of Japanese culture in Europe (7,000 Japanese), will once again be expecting several hundreds of thousands of visitors from near and far. The festival is being prepared with intensive input from Düsseldorf's Japanese community. Before the day culminates in a magical fireworks display at night, Düsseldorf will be transformed for the day into “Japan on the Rhine”. Specialities such as sushi, sashimi or tempura will fortify visitors as delicious snacks. "Kapitalistischer Realismus? 50 Jahre Leben mit Pop" (Capitalist Realism? 50 Years of Living with Pop) exhibition Kunsthalle Düsseldorf	The term "Capitalist Realism" was coined by artists Gerhard Richter, Konrad Lueg, Sigmar Polke and Manfred Kuttner in connection with their self-organised exhibition in Düsseldorf in 1963. Though only used for a short period by these artists, 'Capitalist Realism' soon came to represent a specific style of art in the German post-war era, and to date still generates much controversy. Exhibition „Alexander Calder – Avantgarde in Bewegung (Avant-Garde in Motion)“ Kunstsammlung Nordrhein-Westfalen K20 Grabbeplatz	Alexander Calder is considered one of the great American master artists of the 20th century. The exhibition looks at his shift to abstract sculptures set in motion by air currents in the 1930/40s. His mobiles and stables were created in a potential conflict between geometrical paintings by Piet Mondrians and playful abstractions by Joan Miró and Hans Arp. The exhibition factors in historical and experimental films, avant-garde music and the most innovative visual art companions to understand Calder's connection with European avant-garde, 7 September 2013 – 12 January 2014, Kunstsammlung NRW K20 Grabbeplatz. www.kunstsammlung.de
Exhibition „Candida Höfer. Düsseldorf“ Museum Kunstpalast	Retrospective to commemorate the 70th birthday of Candida Höfer, whose creative work is closely linked with the city of Düsseldorf. Around half of the works shown has never been published or on display before, some of the photos were specifically taken for the exhibition, 14 September 2013 – 9 February 2014. Open house at the Düsseldorf Kunstakademie Kunstakademie Düsseldorf	Annual exhibition of student work at the world-famous Düsseldorfer Kunstakademie towards the end of the winter term: A highlight for art lovers, any other interested parties and gallery owners who are keen to meet tomorrow's artists today, 12 – 16 February 2014. www.kunstakademie-duesseldorf.de
Quadriennale 2014	Under the guiding theme "Beyond Tomorrow", prestigious art museums, exhibition venues and galleries in Düsseldorf will showcase unique works concentrating on visions of the future in art & science from different eras. One such highlight will be the "Art and Alchemy" exhibition at the Museum Kunstpalast presenting works by period artists, masters of the Renaissance and Baroque periods (including Brueghel, Cranach, Dürer and Rubens), and representatives of contemporary art (such as Beuys, Polke, Kiefer). A further high point includes the exhibition "The White Abyss of
